

SYMPOSIUM

“CANADIAN SOCIETY’S INTEGRATION OF WOMEN FROM EASTERN EUROPEAN CULTURES”

Newcomers from eastern European communities face many difficulties when assimilating into the Canadian Society. Women face unique barriers. The inability to speak the English language, cost of childcare, racism, lack of Canadian work experience, domestic abuse, poverty, lack of recognition of foreign credentials, and the hiring policies of many organizations and institutions make it difficult for these immigrant women to successfully assimilate into Canadian culture.

The objective of this symposium is to empower women of Eastern European descent by providing a medium through which to tell their stories, and providing valuable information on organizations, programs, and resources available to them.

FRIDAY (6:00 - 10:00 PM)

Session *Education and Language*

The road to employment winds its way through education. Alberta has set a high standard in learning by scoring top marks internationally in reading, mathematics, and science. Presentations will be made from government and private sector agencies providing information on language courses, translation services, government funding, subsidies, and accreditation.

SATURDAY (8:30 AM - 4:30 PM)

Session 1 *The Hidden and Silent Crime - Domestic Violence*

Domestic violence exists in all countries and across all social classes. It may be something that happens behind closed doors, but it is clearly a problem for society as a whole. Every year, thousands of women and children leave their homes because they are victims of abuse. It is urgent that action be taken. Topics for discussion will include overcoming the cultural acceptance of spousal abuse; where to report and how to get out of an abusive relationship; and how various agencies can help. Together we can curb this sad phenomenon and bring it out of the closed family environment.

Session 2 *Exploring the System of Immigration, Human Rights, and Citizenship*

In 2002, the new Immigration and Refugee Protection Act (IRPA) became law, replacing the former 25-year-old Immigration Act with a clearer modern legislation that reflects the values of Canadian society. The IRPA intends to provide a safe haven for refugees, encourage skilled workers to come to Canada, and help families reunite more quickly. Further, it provides tougher enforcement and penalties for those who pose a threat to Canadian security. In Alberta, the Human Rights, Citizenship and Multiculturalism Act protects Albertans from discrimination. Both systems start with an understanding that individuals in Canada must have legal status. The focus of this session will be on applying for citizenship, what rights you are granted as a citizen, and what resources are available (Government, Social and other).

Session 3 *Employment and Training*

In Canada there exist minimum standards of employment for employers and employees in the workplace. In Alberta, our standards are explained and protected in the Employment Standards Code and the Employment Standards Regulation. As an employer or employee, one must be fully aware of these standards. Information regarding Employment Standards, Human Resources, Employment Mentoring programs and Government funded training will be presented.

Session 4 *Success in Personal and Financial Growth*

Women in business and politics share their stories. Learn how they worked through their challenges and how you can prepare yourself for the future. Learn how to get involved in your community socially, politically and otherwise.
