UKRAINIAN DAY 2007 A GREAT SUCCESS!

Ukrainian Day 2007, held at the Ukrainian Cultural Heritage Village, located 50 km east of Edmonton, was once again an enjoyable time for all those in attendance.

Over 3000 people showed up for the August 12 event, which featured appearances from Alberta Premier Ed Stelmach, Edmonton Mayor Stephen Mandel, and an afternoon full of entertainment from several different groups. The program included performances by Vegreville's Sopilka Dancers, Calgary's Tryzub Dancers, the Kubasonics and Uncas bands, and classical quitarist Peter Polujin.

Speaking for the provincial government, Premier Stelmach noted that the theme of this year's Ukrainian Day was "Ukrainian Roots - Alberta Pride."

"The vital contributions Ukrainian Albertans have made in all sectors of society have helped to build a stronger Alberta," he stated. "To me, there is no better tribute to their legacy than a day like today — a celebration of who we are as proud Albertans of Ukrainian heritage."

Prior to the concert program, a memorial service honouring war dead was held at the Royal Canadian Legion Monument. For the first time at Ukrainian Day, veterans from both the Canadian Forces and the First Division of the National Army of Ukraine participated in the service.

The day's activities also included church services at the St. Vladimir Ukrainian Orthodox Church, St Nicholas Ukrainian Catholic Church, the unveiling of new name plagues at the centenary monument, a village market and musical entertainment at the courtyard and a Ukrainian community showcase at the Red Barn, including a photo exhibit by Lyudmyla Suvorova of Luhansk.

Former Edmonton Strathcona MLA Al Roman Zariwny was presented with the Michael Luchkovich Award, an award which acknowledges outstanding public service by a parliamentarian of Ukrainian heritage.

In his acceptance speech, Zariwny, who was introduced by UCC – APC President Daria Luciw, said he was "humbled and flattered to find myself within a very defined group of recipients of the Michael Luchkovich Award, recipients such as Isidore Goresky and Laurence Decore. Not because they are somehow more distinguished or bring more prestige than the other recipients, but because they like my family, though not exclusively, have affected my life in a number of ways over the course of time.

"I truly feel greatly privileged to accept the Michael Luchkovich Award and to stand in line with the men and women who have been here before me."







Ukrainian Canadian Congress Prepares for New Observer Mission

The Ukrainian Canadian Congress is preparing to send an observer mission to monitor the early elections to Ukraine's parliament scheduled for 30 September 2007. This will be the third mission that the Congress has sponsored as part of its on-going commitment to promoting the development of a fully democratic Ukrainian society.

The size of the mission will be partly determined by the number of volunteers as well as the available resources. Thanks to its previous missions the UCC can draw upon a wealth of practical experience, and has a Kyiv office and Ukrainian support staff ready to be deployed. Once again, the Congress is appealing to Ukrainian community members to support this worthwhile endeavour by generously donating to the UCC. Whereas observers are expected to cover their airfare to Ukraine either personally or through organizational sponsorships, internal travel, some meals and accommodation costs incurred performing monitoring duties will be paid for by the Congress from the mission budget.

Although Ukraine has made positive strides toward achieving a more transparent and fair electoral process, challenges still remain. Since the vote is expected to be hotly contested, extra vigilance will be required to ensure that Ukraine's election laws are not violated by any of the competing parties. The UCC does not endorse individual candidates, political parties or coalitions – its only goal is to help ensure that the decision of Ukrainian voters is made without illegal interference and that the results are respected by electoral authorities.

"Among the many positive effects of electoral missions is that they help to inspire those who go to work as observers, and to reaffirm their appreciation of democratic values. Thus, both Canada and the Ukrainian Canadian community benefit from participation in such missions," notes Jars Balan, the chair of the UCC's Canada-Ukraine Committee. "Furthermore, besides serving as an obvious deterrent to cheating, the presence of outside observers can be reassuring to both voters and election officials. Of course, the involvement of Canadians of Ukrainian descent also demonstrates their solidarity with the citizens of Ukraine as they struggle to shake off the legacy of centuries of authoritarian rule."

Leading the mission will be UCC President, Orysia Sushko, while the organizational committee is being chaired by Emil Yereniuk of Edmonton. The selection of observers will be made in consultation with UCC Provincial Councils.

We invite the Ukrainian community in Alberta to support this mission by making a contribution to UCC-APC for this purpose. We will be sending between 35 - 45 observers from Alberta who have committed their time and personal resources to help. Please identify donations as being for this purpose.

2007 Michael Luchkovich Award Recipient

Michael Luchkovich, in whose honour the Ukrainian Canadian Congress' award for outstanding public service by a parliamentarian of Ukrainian origin was established, stands out in history as the first Ukrainian Member of Parliament

Since 1986, the Ukrainian Canadian Congress - Alberta Provincial Council has honoured many individuals with the Michael Luchkovich Award for their significant contribution and dedication to the betterment of all Canadians.



This year, Al Zariwny was the recipient of the Luchkovich Award. Mr. Zariwny's storied career has included time in law, public service and teaching. He has also spent a great deal of his time getting involved with community efforts, having had a leadership role in many different community leagues and foundations in Edmonton and other communities. In addition, Mr. Zariwny has published several papers, and received many scholarships and awards, including a Canadian Council Doctoral Fellowship, a first for a university graduate specializing in municipal administration.

Visit of the Consul General of Ukraine to Edmonton

The Ukrainian Canadian Congress, Edmonton Branch was pleased to invite and welcome the newly appointed Consul General of Ukraine, Oleksandr Danyleiko to the 16th anniversary of Ukraine's independence celebrations on Sunday, August 26. The celebrations began with a concert and included the Consul General as keynote speaker.

The traditional yearly barbeque followed and many of the people present from the Ukrainian community took the opportunity to welcome the Consul General to Edmonton and speak to him one-on-one.

On Monday, August 27, UCC Edmonton arranged courtesy visits for Mr. Danyleiko with a private tour of the Legislature and a visit with Hon. Gene Zwozdesky, Associate Minister of Capital Planning, where time was spent in discussing the importance of a Consulate in Edmonton and other Canada-Ukraine issues. This was followed by a visit to City Hall and a meeting with Mayor Stephen Mandel. On leaving City Hall, there was a stop at the Holodomor monument. Mr. Danyleiko had commented earlier that this monument had been erected before any recognition of Holodomor in Ukraine.

Lunch was with Wayne Clifford, Assistant Deputy Minister, International Relations and a member of the Advisory Council of Alberta-Ukraine Relations. After lunch, a visit with Dr. Roman Petryshyn, where the work being done by the Ukrainian Resource & Development Centre was discussed. A quick stop for green tea with UCC Edmonton President, Luba Feduschak, then a visit with Bill Diachuk and staff at Ukrainian Canadian Social Services.

Dinner was at the Taste of Ukraine restaurant which the owners Odarka and Yuriy Wozniak had opened specially for this occasion. Guests included members of both UCC Executives, Provincial Council and Edmonton and invited guests. Luba Feduschak thanked Mr. Danyleiko for taking time from his busy schedule to visit Edmonton. The Consul General, in return, thanked UCC Edmonton for the invitation, and the opportunity for meeting with the Ukrainian community and a number of government officials. In ending, he promised that there will be a consulate in Edmonton by 2009.

A hectic but enjoyable visit for the Consul General of Ukraine, and hopefully, one that will have beneficial results.
