CUDA was created in 2003 in Edmonton, Alberta. In the past, CUDA has hosted business delegations from Lviv, Ivano-Frankivsk, Kyiv and Dnipropetrovsk. We have fostered dialogue with government officials and representatives of other provinces concerning the promotion of business in Ukraine

as well as the development of technology exchange and importing and exporting between our two countries.

In November, 2006 CUDA sponsored a business meeting with an IFC (International Finance Corporation) delegation from Ukraine. Six businesses were represented from Kyiv and other regions. Our most recent projects include the development of assisting bringing in temporary workers from Ukraine to the much needed work force of Alberta. #### FRIENDS OF THE UKRAINIAN CULTURAL HERITAGE VILLAGE



On October 31, 2006, the Hilliard Pool Hall was added to the extensive collection of historic structures from east-central Alberta at the Ukrainian Cultural Heritage Village.

The Hilliard Pool Hall, built about 1925, was originally intended to be used as a dance hall and contained living quarters at the back of the building for the owner and his family. It served as a pool hall from the late 1920s to the 1950s, and is one of the last remaining pool halls from that era associated with a town site in the region.

The structure arrived at the Ukrainian Village at the end of October. It will be on display at the main entrance until funding becomes available to restore

it to its original appearance. Once restored, it will join the rest of the Heritage Village on the historic side of the site.

The Friends of the Ukrainian Cultural Heritage Village are taking steps to make history come alive, but we can't do it alone. From its inception in 1987, URDC at Grant MacEwan College has been involved in responding to, and setting up programs to suit the needs of the Ukrainian Canadian Community, and the College.

After Ukraine gained independence, URDC's focus on programming became wider-based to include projects in Ukraine and the establishment of a MacEwan office in Kyiv, Ukraine to assist with those projects.

In 2004, URDC, together with MacEwan faculty & University of Alberta Education faculty, organized the Canada Ukraine Research Team (CURT) to facilitate faculty/student exchanges between Canada and Ukraine.

#### **UKRAINIAN CANADIAN SOCIAL SERVICES (EDMONTON) - UCSS**





On Feb. 3, 2007 Ukrainian Canadian Social Services (Edmonton) celebrated its 30th Anniversary of Incorporation. The Banquet was held at St. John's Ukrainian Orthodox Cathedral Cultural Centre.

In the attendance there were representatives of community organizations, community members and honourable guests Stephen Mandel, Mayor and the main speaker Daria Luciw, President of the Ukrainian Canadian Congress, Provincial Council. Mayor Mandel in his short address stressed on a need to increase the number of immigrants from Ukraine in order to help with the shortage of trade people in Alberta. D. Luciw commended UCSS for its role in settlement process of new Canadians. Furthermore, she spoke about UCC leading role in developing a Province wide communication network with other community organizations.

Among those who attended the banquet there were 55 new Canadians, who chose to live in Alberta. They arrived during the last two years and have used UCSS' services. On behalf of the community, UCSS welcomed the new immigrants and encouraged them to become active members of our Ukrainian community.

Bill Diachuk, UCSS president, thanked all those who in any way have helped the organization to fulfill its goals and provide the community with services not available within the main stream providers.

# UCC MEETS WITH MINISTER MACKAY



On 10 November, 2006 the Ukrainian Canadian Congress (Headquarters) met with the Canadian Minister of

Foreign Affairs, the Hon. Peter MacKay in Ottawa. The UCC delegation, led by President Irene (Orysia) Sushko presented the Minister with a brief on issues relating to Canada Ukraine relations. This document may be viewed by visiting the UCC website www.ucc.ca.

In the brief, UCC asked that Canada take a firm stand in supporting Ukraine against pressure from third countries, specifically Russia. The UCC emphasized the importance of Canada continuing to stand by Ukraine during its democratic evolution.

Fostering Canadian investment and trade with Ukraine is one way that the Canadian government can assist in improving the quality of life for Ukrainians and develop the Canadian economy. UCC pressed home the point that Canada must have a full time Canadian trade officer posted to the Canadian Embassy in Kyiv.

UCC noted that the federal government has cut funding for public diplomacy. UCC urged that this be reconsidered and pointed out the great benefits which accrue to Canada by encouraging cultural, sports and academic exchanges with Ukraine as well as other countries.

2007 will mark the 75th Anniversary of the 1932-33 Famine Genocide in Ukraine. UCC asked the Canadian Government to formally recognize this tragedy as an act of genocide. During the meeting, UCC urged the Minister to ensure that Canada plays a leading role in stamping out the scourge of human trafficking.

UCC was pleased with the meeting and looks forward to continuing positive dialogue with the Minister and the Department of Foreign Affairs.
