A Personal Account From the 2010 Presidential Election Observer Mission in Ukraine

I was in Kyiv for the 2004 Orange Revolution and five years later I was back in the Ukraine for the new rounds of Presidential elections as an observer from Canada.

We were provided copies of the election laws of Ukraine and given training to familiarize us with the laws. We were given questions to be asked at the polling stations to gain information on their voting processes and to be observant of any other happenings in and around the polling stations.

I was posted in Mykolayiv and Kherson in the first round in January and in Sevastopol' (Crimea) for the second vote in February. The days prior to the election we traveled around to the various polling

stations in our region to gather information. The individuals that I met at the polling stations were eager and willing to help out the international observers and answer any questions that we had.

The election days were very long, waking up at 05:30 to observe the official opening procedures at a polling station, then going from station to station to observe events and note any irregularities.

In most cases there were none. In some cases we noted some minor infractions, but nothing that would have changed the outcome of the election. At 20:00 when the polls officially closed

we were locked in the polling station until all the ballots were manually counted and officially recorded (past midnight). From there we would go to the District



Voting Commission office and we would patiently wait for the results to be officially received. The results of all the polling stations (minimum 75 - 100) in our region were then compiled and forwarded on

to Kyiv. This was done into the early morning hours, and it was finally a time for much needed rest.

The people that I spoke to are still optimistic about their future. They are hopeful that they are working towards their dreams of democracy and for a better life to live in Ukraine.

Calgary’s First Ukrainian Festival!

Calgary’s Ukrainian community is saying “Vitajemo!” to all Albertans. This May, the first-ever Calgary Ukrainian Festival is serving up city a big dose of Ukrainian hospitality!

The festival is May 29-30, 2010 at the Triwood Community Centre, 2244 Chicoutimi Dr. NW.

Festival chairman Chris Gnyra says the goal is to showcase “how fun it is to be Ukrainian! All the sights, sounds, tastes, and textiles that make up our colourful and vibrant culture, all under one roof for everyone to experience and enjoy.”

Doors will be open to the public Saturday 11 a.m. until 7 p.m. with five main stage shows and Sunday from 11 a.m. till 5 p.m. with three shows. Non-stop entertainment will keep your toes tapping, from the high-energy choreography of the brightly-costumed Suzirya Ukrainian Dance Theatre and Tryzub Ukrainian Dance Ensemble to the vocal talents of the Korinnya Folk Ensemble and Slava Chamber Choir.

And bring your dancing shoes for a late night “Zabava” (party) starting at 8 p.m. Saturday, where Calgary’s popular polka bands will play live into the wee hours of the morning!

Visitors can browse local vendors and featured artwork and pysanky. Children can get creative in the craft area. And don’t forget your appetite! Sample our locally-made authentic varynyky, holubchi, and kolbassa - washed down by several imported beer and vodka.

The idea of a Ukrainian festival has been in the works for several years. The Calgary Branch of the Ukrainian Canadian Congress initiated the groundwork for organizing such an event and UCC President Mike Ilnycky brought together key members of the community to sit on the Festival’s board.

The goal of the festival is to bring together all of the city’s Ukrainian groups and organizations under one roof and celebrate Calgary’s rich Ukrainian heritage. Ukrainian culture in Calgary dates back to the early 1900’s. In the latest census, Ukrainians make up the city’s sixth largest ethnic group, with more than 76,000 Calgarians claiming descent.

With the exciting milestone of the first Calgary Ukrainian Festival, the hope is to put Calgary on the map as a centre of Ukrainian culture in Canada.
