Former President of Ukraine Petro Poroshenko visit to Edmonton

On November 24-26, 2019, the Ukrainian Canadian Congress, along with the UCC Alberta Provincial Council and UCC Edmonton branch, welcomed former Ukrainian President Petro Poroshenko and his wife, Dr. Maryna Poroshenko, to Edmonton during their private visit to Canada. The fifth president of Ukraine (2014-19), Mr. Poroshenko is currently a people's deputy in Ukraine's parliament and leader of the European Solidarity Party. He was also in Canada as the invited keynote speaker at the 2019 Halifax International Security Forum. The Poroshenkos and their entourage were met at the Edmonton International Airport by Ukrainian Canadian Congress and community leaders, along with a group of youth, including Ukrainian Shumka Dancers.



As personally requested by Mr. Poroshenko, on November 25 the formal program of his visit began with a commemoration ceremony at the world's first Holodomor monument (1983), located at Edmonton City Hall. A moleben service was led by His Grace Bishop Ilarion of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church of Canada. Following the service, Mr. and Mrs. Poroshenko also saw the "Madonna of the Wheat" statue on the grounds of the City Hall. The delegation then continued their program at the Alberta Provincial Legislature, where they first viewed the Ukrainian Centennial Pioneer monument, which stands prominently on the Legislature grounds. Mr. Poroshenko then attended a private meeting with Alberta Premier Jason Kenney, while Dr. Maryna Poroshenko received a guided tour of the Alberta Legislature.

In the afternoon, President Poroshenko gave a guest lecture to standing-room-only at the University of Alberta, organized by the Canadian Institute of Ukrainian Studies. Nearly four hundred faculty, staff, students, and members of the general public attended to hear Mr. Poroshenko speak on the topic "Geopolitical Challenges for Ukraine and Ukrainians in the World." Following the lecture and a meeting with the U of A's President David Turpin at CIUS, the Poroshenkos paid a visit to the new Ukrainian Consulate in Edmonton, which after many years of delay was finally established during President Poroshenko's term in office.



In the evening, President Poroshenko was the guest of honour at a special banquet co-organized by the national Ukrainian Canadian Congress, UCC Alberta Provincial Council, and UCC Edmonton branch. The sold-out event featured greetings from Alberta Premier Jason Kenney, Deputy Prime Minister Chrystia Freeland, MP Garnett Genuis, UCC Alberta Provincial Council



President Orysia Boychuk, and UCC National Vice-president Olesia Luciwi-Andryjowycz. President Poroshenko presented UCC-National President Alexandra Chyczij with a battle-worn Ukrainian flag from the front lines at Avdiivka in Eastern Ukraine, in gratitude for ongoing support of Ukraine by the Ukrainian Canadian community. He provided keynote remarks, including a sincere thank-you to both Premier Kenney and Deputy Prime Minister Freeland for their immense support of Ukraine during difficult times.

On November 19, 2019, the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, in co-operation with the Ukrainian Canadian Congress Alberta Provincial Council, hosted the commemoration ceremony of the 11th Anniversary of the Ukrainian Famine and Genocide Memorial Day Act. Special guests who attended the event included survivor Natalya Talanchuk and Consul-General of Ukraine Oleksandr Danyleiko. Special remarks were given by Hon. Tyler Shandro, Minister of Health, Deron Bilous, MLA, Volodymyr Viatrovych, historian from Ukraine, and Orysia Boychuk, President of UCC Alberta Provincial Council.

Peaceful Protest Against Holodomor Denial

We are concerned about recent the social media posts by an Assistant Lecturer at the University of Alberta who calls the Holodomor a "myth" and a "lie." Despite recognition of the Holodomor by the Canadian Parliament and provincial legislatures across Canada, this is a stark reminder that, even in 2019, we cannot afford complacency in Holodomor education and awareness.



Ukrainian Students' Society at the U of A organized a peaceful protest on campus on December 2, 2019.

We are grateful for the tremendous response to UCC-National's Call to Action, including support from National Chief Perry Bellegarde, Alberta Premier Jason Kenney, many Members of Parliament, Alberta MLAs and friends in the Armenian, Jewish, Polish and Baltic communities. A special thank you to our community in Alberta including the Ukrainian Students' Society at the University of Alberta for leading the Protest on campus and the all the individuals and community organizations who wrote to the University demanding appropriate action. Thank you for being a strong and united in the face of this provocation.
