

Outstanding Leadership Award



Arlene Kryschuk | Opuca Kpuuzyk

Arlene Kryschuk is a dynamic leader whose innovative approaches have significantly impacted various organizations in Ukrainian community and beyond. Since 2020, as Treasurer of the Parent Committee for the Kursy Ukrainoznavstva, she has streamlined financial processes by digitizing reconciliation documents, enhancing transparency, and reducing audit times. Arlene's leadership extended to include hands-on involvement in various projects, as she has spent hundreds of hours volunteering at Kursy and on the board of directors.

Arlene's cultural programming efforts as Komandantka at Plast Seniory Ukrainian Scouting Camp brought enriching experiences to campers by incorporating performances from Ukrainian artists, fostering a deeper connection to their heritage.

At Camp Bar-V-Nok, Arlene's leadership extended beyond financial management to include handson involvement in grounds maintenance and volunteer coordination. Her event management skills were highlighted by a successful dance and silent auction fundraiser, raising over \$5000 for the 4 KURS tour to Europe. Her innovative ideas and ability to inspire and motivate others have consistently driven successful outcomes, making her a valuable asset to every organization she serves.

Dr. Elaine Harasymiw | D-p Onena Tapacunib

Dr. Harasymiw actively served in a broad range of organizations promoting the church, arts, education, women's issues, cultural heritage, and well-being. She made major contributions as an executive member to Ukrainian Self-Reliance League of Canada (USRL) family of organizations principally the local branch, provincial and national Ukrainian Women's Association of Canada (UWAC) and the Ukrainian Museum of Canada (UMC).



As an active executive member of the UWAC, St. John's Branch since 1971, Dr. Harasymiw held numerous leadership roles including that of President for a four-year term; and incoming executive members value her mentorship. She put the organization on a sound financial footing by managing casino events since 2006.

As the President of the Ukrainian Museum of Canada, Alberta Branch, Dr. Harasymiw's latest accomplishment has been to head up a committee which managed the museum's \$134,000 expansion, renovation and modernization. She spearheaded this tribute to the women who opened the museum in 1944, by building the collection, promoting the museum, and educating the public through numerous exhibits and events.



Thor Krys | Trop Kpucs

Since immigrating to Canada in 1990, Ihor has dedicated himself to strengthening Ukraine's democracy and serving the Ukrainian community in Canada. After involving himself in the community as a volunteer and member of the League of Ukrainian Canadians, he took on the various executive positions including Secretary, Vice President and President of the organization. Meanwhile, Ihor stretched his wings in serving as a director on the Board of the Ukrainian Youth Unity Complex, including several years as Vice President, and Treasurer of


both the Alberta Foundation of Ukrainian Education Society and Alberta Ukrainian Media Association. Ihor created educational materials for Holodomor Education and support in the twinning of Alberta and the Ivano-Frankivsk region. His work in coordinating visits of numerous guest speakers from abroad has allowed for Albertans to learn from experts on history and current affairs in Ukraine. This mobilized political action of community members to acknowledge and educate about Holodomor, support publication and dissemination of books on Ukrainian history topics, expose disinformation campaigns against the Ukrainian community, and support fundraising for Ukraine during today's war. Ihor has been an excellent role model as a dedicated multi faceted leader, volunteer and positive encourager on all boards and committees he's been a part of – truly a tireless builder of our community and for a democratic Ukraine.

Orest Fitzowich | Opecm Piyobir

As third generation, Orest dedicates his time and philanthropy work for the Holy Trinity Ukrainian Orthodox Parish of Calmar as President and Treasurer, Trustee for Thorsby St. Peter and St. Paul Ukrainian Orthodox Cemetery, Director for St. John's Fraternal Society, and Member of St John's Institute.

He goes above and beyond by writing historical narratives or newsletters, assisting families with funerals/burials, serving as Parish representative at

Parochial District Meetings. Orest is also the main contact and planner for church



In addition to Teacher, Vice-Principal and Acting Principal of Calmar School, Orest encouraged students to keep up their Ukrainian heritage and greatly contributed to extra-curricular activities; organizing fundraising for the school's sports programs; taking initiative to create the PTA; entering students in the ASAA Curling Zone Playdowns for 8 years, earning several awards; and was Grad Advisor and Student's Union Advisor for 25 years. He is well-respected and appreciated by many for his accomplishments, leadership and helping others.





Vivian Skakun | Bib'en Ckakyn

Vivian Skakun dedicated 25 years advocating for persons with disabilities; 48 years in various capacities on Western Eparchy Council, St. Andrew's Ukrainian Orthodox Sobor Parish Sustainability Committee, Ladies Auxiliary, Provincial and National Ukrainian Women's Association of Canada (UWAC).

As Gateway Association for the Mentally Handicapped Education Chair Vivian advocated for change to the Premier, Education Minister,

and Social Services Minister, Alberta Human Rights Commission, Public School Trustee chair; published papers, contributed to the removal of the "noneducable clause" (Bill 27, 1988) from the school act and promoted a vision of inclusive education.

Vivian wears the Ukrainian Women's Association of Canada (UWAC) Smoloskyp (torch) with pride as it represents the love of her heritage. She authored 60 articles for UWAC magazine Promin. When writing 25-years History (1976-2001) of the UWAC Provincial, Vivian realized the importance of archives and arranged for an Archives Workshop for the Provincial UWAC Biennial Convention (2018). The acceptance of an Archives resolution she submitted to 2019 National UWAC Biennial Convention, resulted in an UWAC archives convener dedicating time to managing UWAC archives.

Vivian demonstrates great qualities of leadership, commitment, and the ability to work with and involve others. She is a dedicated leader working for the greater good of the community.

Outstanding Youth Leader



Inna Ivchenko | Інна Івгенко

Inna Ivchenko demonstrated her leadership capabilities while still a high school student in Ukraine. She served as President of her Student Council and participated in theatre, which she continued to do in her university years. In 2019, after her arrival in Canada, she joined the theatrical group "Suzirya", first as an actor and became Artistic Director the following year. Among her productions, some of her works were compositions of Taras Shevchenko, Lesia Ukrayinka, and Mykhailo Starytsky. Thanks to her leadership, this theatre is thriving with almost 20 active actors and is popularizing Ukrainian culture in Canada.

Since December 3, 2022, Inna revived and has headed the Ukrainian National Youth Federation (UNYF) in Edmonton. Under her leadership UNYF actively supports Ukrainian culture, helps initiate new projects, and organizes rallies in support of Ukraine. In 2024, she headed the Arts and Culture Exhibit for the Ukrainian Pavilion for Edmonton's Heritage Days.

Inna has also played a leading role in organizing concerts for Ukrainian artists in Canada and arranged screenings of films from Ukraine. This not only helps in the retention of Ukrainian culture but enriches cultural exchanges between Canada and Ukraine. She is also one of the founders of the Summer Youth Camp "Hart", which combines the teaching of Ukrainian history with the development of leadership qualities and physical endurance. The camp offers workshops, lessons, self-defence training and various outdoor activities that lead to the all-round development of individuals.

Marko Boychuk | Марко Бойгук

Marko Boychuk stands out as an exemplary youth leader, having significantly contributed to the Ukrainian community through his roles in the Verkhovyna Ukrainian Song & Dance Ensemble and the Ukrainian Youth Association (CYM) - Edmonton Branch. Since 2016, Marko has demonstrated exceptional leadership, starting as a webmaster for the Verkhovyna Ensemble and rising to the position of president by 2021. Under his presidency, Marko initiated the creation of a comprehensive "Policy and Procedures" manual, which amalgamates decades of knowledge and best practices to ensure a smoother transition for future leaders.



Marko's vision and strategic planning are evident in his organization of the Dunai Ukrainian Dancers' 50th Anniversary Tour, set to perform in Montenegro, Croatia, and Bosnia in July 2024.

His leadership extends to CYM Edmonton, where he served as Membership Director from 2018 to 2023. Marko organized annual Christmas caroling events, fostering community spirit and raising funds for youth programs. As the Summer Camp Chair in 2022-2023, he coordinated a camp at Pigeon Lake for 100 children, including newcomers fleeing the war in Ukraine.

Marko has volunteered with Alberta Kontact for years, dedicating countless hours to filming, editing, and anchoring various events in the Ukrainian community in Edmonton and surrounding areas. His efforts have been instrumental in promoting and preserving our cultural heritage.

Exemplary Volunteer Award

Mary Zalucky | Маруся Залуцька

Mary Zalucky can recognize a need and is committed to getting things done which has led to a lifetime of volunteer activities. She currently devotes her time to various community organizations throughout the Edmonton Region.

Mary attended a Ukrainian school (Ridna Shkola) and took part as an active member of the Ukrainian National Youth Federation (UNYF), UWO and UNUF.



Mary was elected to the UWO Executive numerous times, and became the Treasurer and then President. She regularly organized, for members, Grey Cup parties; and made group trips to Banff, Jasper, and Las Vegas. Mary was also a member of the Auditing Committee for many years.

Mary and her husband Leo were the one of the first who financed to UNF building and helped with renovation. It became the home for many immigrants from different generations.

Her volunteer accomplishments made and continue to make a significant difference in the lives of many in the community.



Symen Kostiuk | Cemen Kocmok

Symen Kostiuk is a founding member of the Ukrainian Zustreech Society which was established in Mundare in 1996 to link members of the Ukrainian community. When Russia first invaded Ukraine in 2014, Zustreech, with Symen's initaitve, helped organize a variety of Ukrainian events in and around Kalyna County and assisted in organizing a variety of fundraising events to send non-lethal weapons and medical supplies and to volunteer battalions in Ukraine, and

assisted in sponsoring medical personnel from Ukraine to visit medical

facilities in Alberta, shadow Canadian doctors and raise money for medical supplies.

Since 2016 he has also served as Vice President for the Alberta Foundation for Ukrainian Education Society (AFUES), which supports the development of Ukrainian language education to promote cultural identity in Canada.

Symen is also an accomplished singer and musician and has performed with several choirs. Since 1985, he has been a member of the Ukrainian Male Chorus (Yavir) and has served on the executive organizing concerts locally and abroad. From 2008-2023 Symen has also been a member of Viter Folk Choir, serving both as chorister and musical accompanist. From 2017 he as also been a member of the Ukrainian Bandurist Chorus of North America where he participated in many projects and live performances.

Timko Basaraba | Thuuko Tsacapaba

Timko's deep-rooted commitment to the community service has been instilled in him at a young age. Starting as a young educator in CYM, Timko quickly became a leader in the organization, dedicating years to shaping the experiences of youth at weekly gatherings and camps. Timko's dedication continued as he transitioned into vital logistical roles, taking charge of the smooth operation of camps and all events. His role in organizing and supplying our camps nationwide since 2009 has provided significant support to event organizers, ensuring the success of all events that Timko had been a part of.



In 2023, Timko's leadership journey expanded when he assumed the role of Parent Committee Chair at CYM. His vision for enhancing parent involvement and fostering a supportive environment has been instrumental. His proactive approach and genuine interest in others' goals have led to effective recruitment and motivation of volunteers.

Beyond CYM, Timko's contributions reflect his unwavering commitment to the broader community.

Professional Achievement Award



Darka Tarnawsky | Дарка Жарнавська

While Darka Tarnawsky is known for her exemplary initiative and work as founder of Bottom Line Productions and Executive Director of the Ukrainian Shumka Dancers.

Darka has never shied away from bringing her professional expertise to volunteer and help community activities be successful. As Executive Director of Shumka and President of Bottom Line, there were never 9 to 5 hours or a 5-day week. And yet on top of that commitment, Darka successfully undertakes numerous volunteer projects.

As Chair of Aid for Artists, under the auspices of the Canada Ukrainian Foundation, they very quickly raised \$200,000 to support the arts and artists of Ukraine, and funds continue to be raised.

Sviato 25, the Sherwood Park bilingual program, ACUA, AUDA, and many other organizations have experienced success due to Darka's tenacity and hard work. These organizations and the community have benefited from Darka's knowledge and contacts. Highly respected in the broader community, her activities within the Ukrainian community gain attention because of her reputation and leadership.

Dr. Natalia Khanenko-Friesen | Д-р Наталія Ханенко-Фрізен

Dr. Khanenko-Friesen, as the director of the Canadian Institute of Ukrainian Studies and as a community-engaged scholar, has been closely working with ASAUS and other community and scholarly organizations in Alberta, across Canada, and worldwide. In addition to her role as the director of the Canadian Institute of Ukrainian Studies, her work as a cultural anthropologist is characterized as groundbreaking by the scholarly community and presented in numerous publications.



One of her recent projects involves interviewing newcomers from Ukraine on campus and across Canada who were displaced by Russia's invasion of that country.

She was instrumental in initiating the University of Alberta's rapid response to the war, providing financial means, and raising awareness and support for units across campus to support disrupted students and scholars from Ukraine. Another key project led by Dr. Khanenko-Friesen, to house and protect critical research documents against cyber attack and destruction, is another testament to her ongoing dedication to fostering and protecting our Ukrainian community's cultural and intellectual heritage.

Maryna Chernyavska | Марина Чернявська

Maryna Chernyavska's over a decade-long tenure at the Peter and Doris Kule Centre for Ukrainian and Canadian Folklore (KuFC) reflects her dedication and creativity, which significantly contributed to the Centre's strategic priorities and the needs of the Ukrainian-Canadian community. As a long-term archivist at the Bohdan Medwidsky Ukrainian Folklore Archives (BMUFA), she implemented archival standards through essential policies, digitization efforts, and preservation of analog and digital materials. Collaborating with UCC-



APC, archivists, and volunteers, she played a crucial role in rescuing the archival collections of the Ukrainian Canadian Archives and Museum of Alberta.

Her initiatives, such as the Sustainable Ukrainian Canadian Heritage program and the Indigenous Ukrainian Relationship Initiative, have also made lasting impacts on academic and broader communities.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, Maryna maintained KuFC's high service standards, organized webinars, and a major online event for community archivists. In response to Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine, she was instrumental in the U-ART initiative, run by KuFC, CIUS, and KIAS, facilitating secure data storage for endangered Ukrainian cultural heritage. She also helped archive numerous eyewitness reports through the Writing from the War project.

Ukrainian Crisis Humanitarian Aid Award

The Ukraine Crisis Humanitarian Aid Award recognizes extraordinary Albertans whose volunteer efforts have contributed to the well-being of displaced Ukrainians in Alberta or supported humanitarian aid for Ukrainians in Ukraine impacted by the war. This is a special award due to the extraordinary crisis in Ukraine because of the Russian war on Ukraine.

William Brese Вільям Бріз

Bill has supported newcomers by using his network of friends, church and community to find furniture and household items that would otherwise have been donated or discarded, and coordinated with Catholic Social Services to connect newly arrived or arriving Ukrainian families that need furniture in their rental apartments.



Yevhen Burlaka Євген Бурлака

From the first day of the aggressive invasion of Ukraine, Yevhen helped collect and send medical supplies, military equipment, and other necessary items to Ukraine, and with UNYF he has carried rallies for support, fundraising concerts and events for the Ukrainian Armed Forces and humanitarian organizations.



Olena Danyleiko Олена Данилейко

Olena has been instrumental in supporting displaced Ukrainian newcomers through drama and dance at the "Dzherelo" theater studio under the Olha Basarab UWO, where she volunteers with children and teachers. She led projects like fundraising through cookie sales for newborns in Ukraine and organized a cultural charity evening. Active at events like the Heritage Festival, Olena's efforts show her commitment to Ukraine's future and the Ukrainian community in Canada.



Ukrainian Crisis Humanitarian Aid Award

Diana Kotsyuba Діана Коцюба

Diana has strengthened Edmonton's Ukrainian community by organizing rallies for Ukraine, volunteering at Ukrainian schools and events, and enhancing communication through a bilingual website, newsletter, and social media for the Ukrainian National Youth Federation (UNYF).



Chritine Kuzyk Христина Кузик

Christine developed an English language program in Calgary that helped nearly 6,000 Ukrainian evacuees acquire basic skills. She also organized summer camps, art therapy, and mental health initiatives at Assumption of Blessed Virgin Mary Ukrainian Catholic Church.



Eugenia Leskiw Євгенія Леськів

Eugenia's volunteer duties included collecting household items and clothes and delivering them to Ukrainian families, supporting with Ukraine – English translation, funded to send Ukrainian evacuees kids for free to Kyiv's-K-H Ukrainian camp.



Dr. Oleksandr Pavlenko Д-р Олександр Павленко

Dr. Pavlenko and his team supplied hospitals in Ukraine with high-tech medical equipment, which helped reduce mortality when treating wounded patients. Currently, Dr. Pavlenko is training local doctors to deal with PTSD disorders for the wounded Ukrainian soldiers.



Ukrainian Crisis Humanitarian Aid Award

Carol Slukynski Керол Слукінскі

Carol, co-founder of Hosting Ukrainians in Fort Saskatchewan, has helped over 500 Ukrainian families with housing, jobs, language classes, and mental health support, raising over \$65,000. She also organized cultural events and volunteer efforts to provide essential supplies for newcomers.



John Stadnyk Іван Стадник

John has fostered a relationship between Tryzub and the Ukraine Nightingale Project (UNP) and through his stewardship, the organizations have raised over \$150,000 in support of resettlement of Ukrainian Families displace by war in Ukraine.



Vegreville and Area Stands With Ukraine Committee

VSWU supports Ukrainians by assisting newcomers obtaining health insurance, government assistance, social security numbers, opening bank accounts and more. They financially assisted over 120 newcomers, since March 2022, having raised \$120,000 to offer support in their settlement.



Kristopher Yarish Крістофер Яріш

Kristopher has significantly supported newly arrived Ukrainians by securing employment for seven individuals at an oil site despite language barriers, organizing a children's tubing event, donating to a Ukrainian school, and raising \$5,000 through a golf tournament.





Hetman Awards

The Hetman Awards were established by the Ukrainian Canadian Congress - Alberta Provincial Council in 1998 to recognize significant volunteer achievements of outstanding Ukrainian Albertans. The Annual Hetman Awards are dedicated to the celebration of all volunteers who have chosen to give their time, effort and expertise in order to keep our Ukrainian Canadian community in Alberta strong, vibrant and active.

Each recipient is recognized symbolically in the name of Ukraine's Hetmans, who were outstanding leaders that fought for generations for their country's independence and cultural preservation.
